


Mission:




Thank you for your support as we ventured into our second decade! As COVID restrictions eased and awareness of the benefits of doula support grew, we had many expectant parents reaching out to us for doula services in 2021-22. Many of these clients were referred to us by ARMS Clinic, Simon Williamson Clinic, or through word of mouth. This year, we matched work-study and volunteer doulas with clients, and added nearly a dozen contract doulas in order to meet increased demand.

Doula services are a low-tech, high-touch way of making an impact on the life of a family. Doulas work with pregnant people at a key touchpoint in their life, encouraging healthy decisions and supporting the foundational event of birth. Interest in community doula services has grown, because the benefits are great compared to the cost: for \$500 - \$1000, BWP can provide doula services to a low-resource family (Services include 2 prenatal visits, continuous labor support, and 2 postpartum visits, as well as unlimited phone/text/email support during the relationship.) A client supported by a doula is less likely to give birth too soon, or to a low-birthweight baby, or to have a cesarean birth. They are more likely to breastfeed their baby. Everyone goes home from the hospital sooner and in better health.

In addition to doula services, this year we partnered with the Alabama Department of Mental Health, Special Women's Services, to teach childbirth classes to residents at Olivia's House and Aletheia House. We look forward to growing our collaboration with ADMH.

Doula Services: 46 Clients Supported During Labor



BirthWell Work-Study, Volunteer, and Contract Doulas served 52 families last year and attended the births of 46 babies. As you can see from above, clients appreciated the informational, emotional, and physical support that their doulas provided. Most felt that having a doula made a positive difference in understanding how to advocate for themselves in medical settings, and in understanding the importance of breastfeeding. Doula services had a measurable impact on the well-being of parent and child, as shown below. Compared to baseline data, fewer BWP clients had preterm or low birthweight babies, fewer had cesarean births, and 94.75% breastfeed at least one time.

This year was a busy one for doula trainings! Trainings are vital to the continuation of our work. Of the 39 workshop attendees, 7 received work-study positions from BWP and have committed to attending 2-3 births each for BWP clients. About half of the self-pay attendees are also giving to the community by attending births for BWP clients. We are so grateful to our volunteers and work-study doulas for ensuring that we can provide doula services to those who need it most. And, we are excited that the doula profession in Alabama is growing, with the addition of these beautiful, caring individuals!

In addition to our work-study and volunteer doulas, we hired several contract doulas to help us meet the growing demand for services. Doula services are not covered by insurance or Medicaid, which makes community doula work challenging. But through grants and donations, we have been able to pay these doulas an equitable fee for supporting clients who don't have the means to hire a doula.
